EXPECTATIONS FOR INDIVIDUAL BOARD MEMBERS

Terms are 2 years long, starting in June. The average time commitment is 1.5-4 hrs/month.

Your role:

- Understand HCW's mission, policies, programs, and needs
- Read HCW's financial statements and help ensure financial viability
- Serve as an advocate and ambassador for HCW
- Fully engage in identifying and securing the financial resources and partnerships necessary for HCW to advance its mission
- Leverage connections, networks, and resources to develop collective action
- Help identify personal connections that can benefit HCW's fundraising and reputational standing and can influence public policy
- Prepare for, attend, and conscientiously participate in at least 50% of board meetings (1.5 hr per month)
- Give a meaningful donation or volunteer your time on fundraising efforts
- You will also be expected to: (1) Follow HCW's bylaws, policies, and resolutions; (2) Disclose all conflicts of interest during meetings and sign a disclosure; (3) Maintain confidentiality about HCW internal matters
